

Noyes sworn in a state trooper  
Silver Lake man graduated from Kennett High in 1996

CONCORD -- Nate Noyes, of Silver Lake, was sworn in Friday as a state trooper.

N.H. Safety Commissioner Richard M. Flynn made the announcement in a press release yesterday afternoon. State Police Col. Gary M. Sloper headed the swearing in ceremony.

Noyes, a 1996 graduate from Kennett High School, holds a BA in sociology and political science from Quinnipiac College in Hampden, Conn., and a masters degree in public administration from University of New Hampshire.

Noyes, who earned the entry level rank of probationary trooper, is enrolled in an extensive physical, firearms and classroom training program at N.H. Police Standards and Training Academy in Concord. Upon successful completion he will be assigned to a division field training officer for additional instruction during the remainder of a one year training program.

He is the son of Debbie Noyes of Silver Lake and the late N.H. State Police Sgt. Jim Noyes, who was killed in the line of duty in 1994.
